George Oakley Totten, 80, a member of the old Staten Island family after whom Tottenville is named, died yesterday in his home, 82 North Eleventh street, Newark. He was born at Tottenville and for about twenty years was a grocer in this city. Forty years ago he moved to Newark and entered the real estate business. He was the founder of the Eleventh Ward Building and Loan Association there. His wife, who was a member of the old Styles family, died several years ago. He is survived by a daughter, Ada, and a son, George O. Totten, Jr., an architect of Washington.
